






English Writing, Reading and GPS - Our Topic: Instructions. We are now moving to a new unit of work based on reading and writing instructions.

Monday	<p><u>Introducing instructions</u></p> <p>Have a go at reading the instruction text about making a friendship bracelet. Can you follow the instructions to make it?</p>  <p>Instructions always include commands. They tell you to do something rather than asking you nicely. In the friendship bracelet instruction text, the commands are cut, stick, decorate and give.</p> <p><u>Command quiz</u></p> <p>Look through the quiz. There are lots of pictures taken from instructional texts. Can you guess the command that goes with each picture?</p>
Tuesday	<p><u>What makes a good set of instructions</u></p> <p>Have a go at reading and making the instructions for the paper plate fish. If you don't have a paper plate at home, just use a circle of paper or card from a cereal box.</p>  <p>Look through the list of features from the What Makes a Good Set of Instructions list. Can you spot any of these features in the Paper Plate Fish text?</p> <p>See the annotated version to check whether you spotted them correctly.</p>
Wednesday	<p><u>How to start a set of instructions</u></p> <p>Today, we are going to have a go at writing an introduction for a set of instructions. Just the introduction - nothing more. Look at the model examples. They have a clear structure.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Title (what you are making) 2. Introduction - begin with a question

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	<p>3. Sub-heading 4. Bullet pointed list of equipment</p> <p>Now, have a look at the sheet of possible equipment. Choose three things from this sheet. What could you make with them? (This can be a bit fun or crazy if you like - what could you make with the paints, glue and chocolate?) Have a go at writing an introduction for a set of instructions.</p> <p>To finish today's lesson, have a go at this super-movers clip about adjectives and adverbs. Thursday	<p><u>Grammar: Adverbs</u></p> <p>Watch this clip on BBC bitesize to remind you what an adverb is. https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zwwp8mn/articles/zgsgxfr</p>  <p>Now have a look at the grammar sheet. Can you rewrite the sentences including one of the adverbs from the box? Adverbs are very interesting because you can put them into different places within a sentence.</p> <p>Stir the pan carefully. Carefully, stir the plan.</p> <p>When the adverb is at the beginning of a sentence, you need to use a comma. This is called a fronted adverbial.</p>
Friday	<p><u>Dictionary Work and Reading</u></p> <p>Next week, we will be writing a set of instructions for how to make an Egyptian mummy. Today, we will prepare for this by doing some background reading to make sure we know all about mummification.</p>

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	<p>Before we read the text, let's find out the meaning of some tricky words. Use a dictionary to look up the meaning of these words. If you don't have a dictionary, use an online dictionary.</p> <p>Preserving Complicated Process Purified Shroud Linen</p> <p>Now have a go at reading the text about mummification.</p>
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Handwriting

Monday	Handwriting sheet based on the ough letter pattern. Do half today and half tomorrow.
Tuesday	Second half of the handwriting sheet.
Wednesday	There is a copy of the poem called Piercing the Veil. Can you guess what it is about...? Please create a best copy of this poem using your neatest handwriting.
Thursday	Continuing writing out the poem.
Friday	Having good handwriting is all about pencil control. Practise your pencil control by copying some of these Egyptian patterns.

Guided Read on Share Point – Try logging on to Share Point and looking in the Y3 video library. Mrs Brown is continuing to read a story called The Wizards of Once. This is great for your child to hear a story read aloud and would be like us having a guided reading session at school. Remember to read the story in the right order. The clips are numbered.
