
Thursday 14th May - LO: To recognise and use appropriate determiners



Determiners are words that come before a noun. They introduce the noun and can give the reader important information about it.

They can be split into different types of determiners, which again can be split, based on how they are used. See separate grid on next page.

Specific determiners

Your writing is brilliant!

They put on *their* snow boots.

I love *these* flowers!

General determiners

Can you bring the other pens please?

Mum baked twelve cupcakes.

I would love *some more* chocolates!

General


These refer to general nouns or nouns that the reader does not know.

General determiners can also tell the reader how many nouns you are talking about; these are called quantifiers.

Specific

These refer to a specific noun.
Use specific determiners when the reader knows exactly what noun you are referring to.
