Kobocca software has been used with all children to survey the national primary pupil activity & wellbeing survey 2024-2025. The PE coordinator has also received training and completed Level 1 Handball. • Staff (JG) completed Swim Teacher course to enable her to deliver and support core swimming lessons. • Employ Football & Fitness Ltd has delivered lessons to year 4 & 6 classes with HLTA's supporting for own professional development. • Football & Fitness Coach (Joe) has delivered a wide range of sports during lunch and through the afterschool programme. 95 children have attended an after-school club with many children attending more than one. <p>PE Coordinator has provided opportunities for CHJS children to attend 3 levels of sporting competitions: Inspire – Develop - Excel 79 different children have represented the school in different Excel sporting event including football, cross country, dodgeball, basketball and athletics. 71 children attended an inspire Sports Festival held at the local Secondary School in June 2025.</p>
