YHA National Forest, Swadlincote

An eco-friendly hostel which offers purpose-built en-suite accommodation next door to the Conkers visitor Centre.





The rooms at National Forest are to an excellent standard.

Each room consists of 2 or 4 beds and will each have an there own en-suite.

No bedding will be required as it is all supplied by YHA.

The National Forest site is fully secure.

We have exclusive booking during our visit. We will be the only party in the hostel.

We will use the centre as a base for some activities, as well as walking to Conkers and Visiting the Moria Furnace

This year we are doing all the catering ourselves.

The first night we have a fish and chip van coming to cook us tea.

And the second night staff from school will be coming over to help prepare tea for the children. Some of which will have been prepped in school that day.

Breakfast will consist, of cereal, toast, fruit and juice or milk.

Lunch will be made by the children on site, this will be a packed lunch of sandwiches, crisps, biscuit bar and fruit. We will also be providing popcorn on movie night and juice and snacks during the day. By doing this we have taken almost £3,000 off of the cost of the trip.

Itinerary for the trip

- Wednesday, drop luggage at the YHA, and then spend the day at the Moria Furnace.
- Thursday, we will be having a full day on site.
- Friday, we will leave site after breakfast and spend the morning in Conkers, before getting back to school around 2.30pm
