English Writing, Reading and GPS – Our Topic: Grammar. We have done a lot of lovely writing recently, but we now need to have a focus on some grammar. All of this week's lessons are revision from KS1 or from work already covered in Year 3 before lock down.

Monday	<p><u>Inverted commas</u></p> <p>We have already done some work on inverted commas before lock down, so this should be revision. To help explain the grammar rules, we are going to use some video clips from the internet.</p> <p>Start with a warm up with super-movers. https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/supermovers/ks2-english-inverted-commas-with-mr-smith/z62rhbk</p> <p>Here is some more information about when and how to use inverted commas. https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zvwwxnb/articles/ztcp97h</p> <p>Finally, finished with the inverted comma grammar sheet. Can you put the inverted commas into the correct places in the sentences?</p>
Tuesday	<p><u>Co-ordinating Conjunctions</u></p> <p>These are little joining words that join parts of sentences together. There are only 7 of them. See below.... A large poster is included as a support sheet.</p> <div data-bbox="507 1205 1299 1599"> </div> <p>Watch the clips and read the information on this page to remind yourself what a coordinating conjunction is.</p> <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zwwp8mn/articles/z9wvqhv</p> <p>Have a look at the coordinating conjunctions sheet given for home learning. Can you make a fan? On each section of the fan, write a sentence using one of the coordinating conjunctions. The fan helps us to remember the coordinating conjunctions because the first letter of each word spells FANBOYS.</p>

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Wednesday	<p><u>Subordinating Conjunctions</u></p> <p>These are also joining words and can be remembered in a different way. See below but there is also a poster version for you to see too.</p>  <p>Watch this clip and read the information on this page. https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zwwp8mn/articles/zqk37p3</p> <p>Use the Subordinating Conjunctions poster to help you complete the subordinating conjunction jigsaw. Because there are lots of possible answers here, I can't give you an answer sheet, but if you try writing directly onto the sheet using notebook, then I should be able to mark it for you.</p> <p>Finally, remind yourselves all about subordinating conjunctions with this super movers clip. Thursday	<p><u>What is a noun?</u></p> <p>Take a look at the clips and information all about nouns. https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/zjrdwtv</p> <p>Have a go at the sheet. Highlight people in yellow, places in orange and things in pink.</p>
Friday	<p><u>Revision of this week's grammar</u></p> <p>Make up a game for your family to play that includes all the grammar we have learnt this week: inverted commas, conjunctions and nouns.</p>

Handwriting

Monday	Handwriting sheet based on more homophones (words that sound the same but have different spellings and meanings). Do half today and half tomorrow.
Tuesday	Second half of the handwriting sheet.
Wed/Thur/Fri	Homophones are tricky because you have to understand the meaning of the words. Over the next three days, look up each word from your spelling list in a dictionary (or use an online one), write out the meaning <u>in best handwriting</u> and a sentence containing that word to show you understand the meaning.

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Guided Read on Share Point – Try logging on to Share Point and looking in the Y3 video library. Mrs Brown is continuing to read a story called The Wizards of Once. This is great for your child to hear a story read aloud and would be like us having a guided reading session at school. Remember to read the story in the right order. The clips are numbered.

Challenge 5 50m Shuttle Run
How quickly can you complete 5 lengths of a 10metre course?


What you'll need:

- Cones, pegs, tape, tins or clothes to use as markers
- Measuring tape/ruler
- Stopwatch to record your time

How to play:

- Set up a 10m running lane with markers at either end
- The aim is to run the 10m distance a total of 5 times to complete 50m as quick as you can
- Get help from someone at home to record your time with the stopwatch

Challenge 6 Obstacle Course
Set up a course using household objects outdoors and set your own rules for success.
