



Mutual Respect



Respect is the foundation of all human behavior. To have respect for a person involves a fundamental belief in their right to exist, to be heard, and to have the same opportunities as everyone else. Respect doesn't mean ignoring people's differences, or simply tolerating them. Rather, it involves recognising differences, understanding their importance and responding with interest, politeness and care.

With mutual respect, we avoid labeling people in unhelpful ways. Instead, we celebrate the unique things that each of us brings, which makes our school community a much happier place!

EVERYONE is equal, always keep that fact in mind,


CARE for others and be considerate and kind.
