

Mutual Respect

Mutual respect is about everyone being valued for who we are and what we bring to the community. It involves seeing people's unique contributions, recognising and understanding differences, and celebrating diversity. Furthermore, it is about understanding that we all don't share the same beliefs and values and, respecting the values, ideas, and beliefs of others, whilst not imposing our own on

In school, we believe that receiving respect from others is important because it helps us to feel safe and to express ourselves. Being respected by important people in our lives, such as friends, teachers and family members, teaches us how to be respectful toward others. If we can role-model respect in relationships, our children will build feelings of trust, safety, and a healthy sense of wellbeing.

Mutual Respect is a value that is important to us because it means we care about other people's feelings. It means that we treat other people they way we want to be treated which can be difficult especially when others have not shown mutual respect. We do this by promoting good manners, listening well to how people want to be treated, and by helping children to get to know one another and to become more informed about their differences.
