The king said, "Build him a bigger cage."


So they built a bigger cage, and planted fir trees in it, and brought rocks and made a cave. But still the wolf paced up and down, up and down, and his eyes were wild.

1 The howl of another wolf.

2 1 mark each for any of the following answers; maximum of 2 marks.

He gave the wolf the best food/venison/veal.

He built a bigger cage.

He put fir trees in the wolf's cage.

Acceptable: he got the moon to make a she-wolf/save Grey Wolf.

Unacceptable: Single words or short phrases without a verb, for example:

best food/cage/trees (because these do not answer 'how'

the king tried to make him happy).

3 Answers should refer to Grey Wolf's distress at being alone and/or in captivity.

He wanted to be free • go home • he was wild • his cage was too small • didn't like being captured/caged.

He was lonely • wanted a mate/friend/other wolves.

He couldn't hear the voice of another wolf • no other wolf was howling • everything was calling him from outside the cage.

Unacceptable: he was bored/sad/unhappy (not precise enough).

Because his eyes were wild.

5 Answers should clearly refer to the fact that the king thought that there was a connection between the wolves and the moon, or that the king thought the moon had special powers.

He remembered how wolves howled at the moon/the moon makes wolves howl/wolves howl in the moonlight.

He thought the moon held some special powers/magic.

• he thought the moon was powerful • because he believed in the moon.

Acceptable: Because the moon said. 'I will help you'/

said it would help.

Unacceptable: Because the moon shone in the cage.

Because the wolf was unhappy. Because he wanted to help the wolf.

6 Both of the following words needed for one mark:

bone thin (also accept these words embedded in a longer phrase, eg his bones were thin; because the bones were thin; he had thin bones).

Unacceptable: he refused to eat (refers to incorrect page).

Very thin. He was bony.

7 The author uses the word silver a lot.

The she-wolf had silver fur/fang/feet/whiskers/tail/eyes/breath. The she-wolf was (very) silver/silver all over/covered in silver/nearly silver/had silver on her.

Unacceptable: (answers which refer to the picture alone)

All the water came off/like a wet dog shaking.

She changed (not developed).

She had silver fur.

Answers should refer to the change that had taken place in the king's attitude, or clearly refer to his pleasure at the idea of the future of the wolf species.

Because he had learnt not to kill wolves • he had learnt to care (about them).

Because he didn't want the same thing to happen again.

Because he wanted the wolves to live in peace.

Because he didn't want them to be the last wolves • he had helped the wolf/wolves to survive • because at first Grey Wolf had been the only wolf • because there were only 1 (or 2) left/there would be no more left/they would be extinct.

Because he **now** understood how the wolf felt when he had been captured • he **now** felt sorry.

Because they were precious.

Because he **now** loved Grey Wolf and the little cubs/family

• because he loved them **now**.

Unacceptable: Because of what happened (not precise enough).

Because he liked them/loved them • he thought

they were nice.

Because he was sorry/sad for them. Because there were some small cubs. Because it would be cruel. Because they are wild. Wolves are living things. Because Grey Wolf was lonely.
