<u>English Writing, Reading and GPS - Our Topic: Legends.</u> This would have been our Greek Week if we had been at school. The whole school should have been learning about the Ancient Greeks. The Greeks had the most exciting myths and legends. This week, we are going to learn the story of Perseus and Medusa and try to write a short description of Medusa.

Monday	Learning the Story of Perseus and Medusa
	Begin by reading the story of Perseus and Medusa. You can read it by yourself or you can log on to Sharepoint and read it with Mrs Brown.
	Once you have read it, please write a short summary of the story. A summary is a very short recount of the main points from the story. Can you retell the story in about 4 sentences? If you watch Mrs Brown's video on Sharepoint, she will give you some tips.
Tuesday	Preparing for writing a description of Medusa
	Re-read the story from yesterday or watch the video on Sharepoint again.
	Now read the short description of Medusa. Can you use the description to label the picture of Medusa?
	Finally, plan some similes. Hopefully you can remember what a simile is from the description of the dragon last week. Here two examples: Medusa's tusks were as sharp as knives.
	Her wings were <u>like a bat</u> .
	Use the help sheet to plan some similes to describe Medusa's features. Can you write a simile for her wings, tusks and eyes?
Wednesday	Writing a description of Medusa
	Watch this You Tube clip to remind yourself of the story. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=qbYkejgeAXc
	Today you are going to write a fabulous description of Medusa. We will use your ideas from yesterday but let's begin by thinking about her hair. It was made of snakes.

How many different species of snake can you name?

How do snakes move? Look 'wriggle' up in a thesaurus (if you don't have one, look online or use the thesaurus option on Microsoft word - click on 'review' and then click on 'thesaurus').

Now look at the model text. Can you use it to write your own?

How to structure your writing

- 1. Introduce Medusa
- 2. Describe her wings, claws, tusks, hair, eyes
- 3. Tell the reader she can turn people to stone
